APPLICABLE REGULATION FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF TRAINING LANES ON THE GRANDE MOTTE GLACIER SUMMER & AUTUMN 2025



1. AREA COVERED BY THE REGULATION

These regulations apply as soon as one has rented a specific site on Tignes ski area (Grande Motte glacier or other pistes).

2 BOOKING CONDITIONS

- Bookings are open as follows, depending on snow conditions and the opening dates of the ski area:

5 may / 16 may	Lanches
21June / 20 July	Glacier
15 October / 16 November	Snowfarming
16 November / 23 November	Glacier
23 November / 4 May	Ski Area

The bookings are expected by postal mail or by e-mail <u>pistescentral@tignes.net</u> indicating the coach contact numbers in Tignes, the number of competitors, their level and their speciality (i.e. slalom, giant slalom, freestyle, snowboarding etc), in order to organize the schedule.

• The Ski Patrol office, located 104 Impasse de La Marlière in Tignes Le Lac, will be open to the coaches every day from 23 November to 4 May and from Monday to Friday from 5 May to 22 November.

- Last-minute booking and placement: please contact Tignes Ski Patrol (+33 4 79 06 32 00), who will inform the patrollers responsible on the glacier, and vice-versa.

• Keep the ski patrol office informed (+33 4 79 06 32 00) in case of date changes or in case of cancellation, so that the lane can be allocated to another team.

• The management of the ski area may in any case decide to close the slalom stadiums for safety reasons, and reserves the right to cancel reservations within a maximum of three days before the first day of availability of the stadium, refunding the rental without further compensation.

3 PROCEDURAL ORGANISATION ON THE GLACIER

• The ski patrol in charge of race areas, the regional controller and his deputies are the contact points for trainers on the glacier, they represent the Régie des Pistes on the ground.

Teams that have booked a trraining lane will go directly to the training area, where a ski patroller will be present. He will indicate the locations at check-in, after checking the training protocol.

• Under no circumstances will the trainer start to set up his poles before he has been given the precise location, in order to optimise the training lanes.

- Lanes which have not been used by 9:30 a.m. will be allocated to another team, in order to maximise the number of lanes within the race area.

Possible changes of lanes will be dealt with on a case by case basis according to availability, directly with the trackers in charge of the stadiums, with the agreement of the chef de massif or the deputy.

• The use of the pistes dedicated to training is subject to an agreement signed between Tignes Ski Patrol and the training structure or team using the piste. A session monitoring protocol is drawn up and must be submitted before any training session. It sets out the planned training procedures and designates the main people in charge of the training.

Sharing lanes:

The snow conditions and security rules could require that several teams share the same lane to fill it, and that bookings could be cancelled in case of very bad weather conditions. When more than one slalom course is to be laid out in the same race area, it is the responsibility of trainers to ensure that the race lanes and starts are sufficiently far apart to avoid any collision between competitors.

4 SECURITY AND MAINTENANCE

The coach is responsible for the application of the safety rules on the lane assigned to him.

He must respect and ensure respect for the municipal decree relating to safety on the ski slopes and on the areas reserved for the practice of specific sliding activities, and the rules of conduct for users of the slopes.

Training sessions and competitions take place under the responsibility of the trainers and/or organising bodies, who must, before each training session or competition, ensure the safety of these stadiums with regard to competitors and outsiders.

He must respect and ensure respect for the municipal by-law on safety on ski slopes.

Access to the training lanes is forbidden to persons not participating in training and/or competitions. This prohibition shall be notified by the installation of suitable signs (banners, panels, etc.) and/or a device (net, tape, elastic bands, snow merlon, etc.) preventing access to persons not taking part in training and/or competitions. The installation of these devices will be the responsibility of the manager of the dedicated area or its user.

It is forbidden for safety reasons to move the markers and protections.

5 GATE STORAGE

- To allow for efficient grooming of the lanes, it is essential to gather all gates at the end of training each day and put them at the top of the lane.
- To maintain the condition of the site, you must clear your lane and bring down any broken gates and your group's rubbish.
- We suggest that you regularly check the weather forecast: If access to the site is uncertain, you may need to take your gates down in advance.
- We will not arrange a vehicle to recover equipment left on the glacier.
- In case of a storm, one trip on the funicular will be arranged for you to bring your gates down.

6 USE OF THE LIFTS

The Tignes ski patrol allocates the reserved training lanes.

Transport of the poles:

For your convenience, we invite you to set up the training poles the day before in the afternoon (see lift opening times). To do this, you will need a pedestrian transport ticket offered by the STGM, which you can collect from the Grande Motte ticket offices. To avoid penalising our customers, it is essential that poles are transported from 9.30am onwards. The 12.00-14.30 time slot should be avoided for the descent of the poles.

In the event of a particular problem, such as a delay in opening due to bad weather or technical breakdowns, the manager will have sole discretion as to whether or not to raise the poles.

In addition, no poles may be stored in the funicular bottom station.

Use of the Lifts must be used in compliance with STGM police regulations. If you do not respect these rules, you will be refused access. Strict measures including the withdrawal of ski passes will be imposed in case of non-compliance with the regulations.

Skipass

We inform you, that you are obliged to have your ski pass on you all the time. You must be in a position to present your pass to any member of the lift company staff who requests it.

7 ADVERTISING

Public advertising on the glacier is forbidden. Only with permission from the mayor is advertising for major events allowed.

We hope you have excellent training conditions on the "Grande Motte". These regulations are put in place in order to improve conditions for everybody.
